Michelle returned to San Francisco where she served as Executive Chef of Barzotto, a fast casual, high-quality pasta restaurant.

In 2017, Michelle was named a "Rising Star Chef" in the San Francisco Chronicle. Michelle has since left Barzotto to pursue her own professional endeavors that build community, promote equality, and celebrate the people who grow and make our food. It's the relationships she's developed with farmers and memories of growing up picking fresh veggies in the garden that inspires her to cook with quality ingredients and informs her respect for their origins and history.
